Forest School

Forest School has begun! Pupils have already engaged in a wide range of activities that require teamwork, communication, trust, problem solving and



finding creative solutions, learning through mistakes. The crossover this presents with their academic learning includes resilience, trying something different and perseverance. They have completed a range of team building challenges, done some den building, assault course making, made stick, bench and tyre swings, they've made cargo netting from rope, learnt new knots and have guided each other while blindfolded, including through an assault course and while skipping with a large rope swung by staff!

As we move further into the year we will start learning how to safely build and manage wood-based fires. We will also be teaming up with Food Tech to get some delicious campfire treats going! Fire building with young people is very calming and satisfying for young people, as they gradually take ownership of the responsibilities involved, including whittling the wood shavings used the get the fire started.

We have invested in some equipment to support forest schoolwork and have organised a couple of trips, both of which we are looking to expand on as the year progresses. We have some permanent wooden posts being concreted in this half term which will complement the A-Frames we are already using for many of the tasks and challenges.

Curriculum Updates

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Physical Education Mrs Burford

This half term has flown by! The boys in all year group have been enjoying their Physical Education lessons. We have played different sports across the year groups including badminton and indoor short tennis. As always we continue to play dodgeball but the main focus this half term has been volleyball. The boys in all year groups have shown an improvement in skills and can now keep the ball moving and some are starting to think about how they move the ball. The year 8 and year 9s have also played some handball and are just starting to get to grips with the rules! A nice warm up game played across year groups is Pacman - one player is Pacman, the others are ghosts and they can only move along the white lines on the floor. The ghosts must try and catch Pacman, but there is a power up available that enables Pacman to catch the ghosts!

Next half term is certain to be jam packed again and we will continue to master the skills in volleyball and (weather permitting) I'd love to take the students to the tennis courts to play on a full size court!

Food Technology

English

This half term in English we have very much hit the ground running: at KS3 we have been developing our key reading skills of prediction, questioning, clarifying and summarising; year 10 have been undertaking the first component of their Step Up to English qualification; and, year 11 have been working on the persuasive writing skills required for Language Paper 2.

Next half term, KS3 will undertake the reading of a more challenging narrative text. Year 10 will move onto developing the writing skills to

complete the next steps for their qualification and year 11 will cover the reading skills required for Language Paper 2 such as summarising, analysis and comparison.





Maths

We have had a great start to the academic year in Maths.

KS3 started the term learning about ratio and proportion and then moved on to fractions. Year 10 have been working particulary well and making fantastic progress with the start of their GCSE couse, working on enlargements/scale factors and similar shapes, congruency, and trigonometry. Year 11 have continued their GCSE course with linear and non linear graphs.

We are looking forward to seeing the students build on this over the next term.


