**Physical Education** *Mrs Burford* 

PE this year has started off very well. We are playing badminton, indoor tennis and dodgeball with all classes. All classes are working well and developing their skills through each sport.

Year 7 sometimes play 'Pacman' to warm up: walking along the lines in the sports hall, one pupil named Pacman, all others named as ghosts. The ghosts need to tag Pacman. Cones are used for power-ups - if Pacman grabs a cone he can tag the ghosts. Power ups only last for 10 seconds though! The game ends either when Pacman is tagged or all ghosts are tagged. The Year 7s are enjoying this game and it contributes to tactics and communication.

Dodgeball is also developing well, with some smaller groups using points if they hit an opponent rather than being 'out' of the game. This keeps the game moving constantly.

KS4 pupils are focusing on their BTEC Sport, and using lessons to practice their individual and team sports.





# **Curriculum Updates**

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# **Food Technology**

Food Tech has been full on this term.
Year 11 have been continuing with their
BTEC coursework. This has been tricky
at times but they have really
persevered and I am very proud of
them.

Years 8,9 and 10 have been creating the original and famous street food, Bang-Bang Chicken, originating in Szeuchan. Spicy, spicy!! Year 10 have also thrown themselves into making cakes for our Lakeside visitors.

Year 7 have been continuing with basic cooking skills, focusing on knife safety. They have also made some delicious sponge cakes.

#### **Forest School**

This half term we are looking at ways we can improve our Forest School area. Together with the students, we have been researching elements such as permanent shelters and handmade furniture, all of which the students could make themselves with tools and guidance. Our next stage is compiling student drawings of what they would like the area to look like and come up with a final design incorporating their ideas. The plan is then to start sourcing materials and working on making this a reality!

We also practiced some more fire building, reviewing and incorporating some of the designs students have previously learnt, reinforcing the learning with designs such as the Swedish Torch and Upside-Down fire, using a ferro rod and cotton to get the fires started.

#### **Maths**

Year 11 have sat their Mock Exams this week, demonstraing fantastic maturity and resilience.

Year 10 were introduced to trigonometry this term. A tricky subject to get to grips with, but they have taken to it well knowing that it was not something that they have encountered before.

KS3 have also been introduced to a new topic this term: algebra. They have engaged very well and some of them have actually enjoyed it, dare I say!

# English

In English this term, our KS3 students have been studying poetry: what it is; techniques used; and, in particular, how it relates to music lyrics. We have been studying poems by James Kirkup, Kate Tempest, Benjamin Zephaniah and the lyrics by Michael Jackson.

Oak Class have been working hard on their reading skills for Functional Skills. They have also produced some brilliant creative writing and have written extended stories titled *The Weather Tree* and *The Protector of The Forest*.

Year 10 have also been working on their Functional Skills and creative writing, alongside preparing for their Speaking and Listening assessment for GCSE English.

Alongside continued focus on Functional Skills, Year 11 have been working on their exam techniques for their upcoming GCSE exams.

We are looking forward to welcoming Miss MacDonald as our new literacy lead teacher after half term.

This term in Art, students have been studying the mark making of Van Gogh and have had great fun experimenting with oil pastels.
